He will judge the peoples in fairness. **R.**


### **Second Reading – 1 Thessalonians 1:1-5**

### **Gospel – Matthew 22:15-21**

The Pharisees went away to work out between them how to trap Jesus in what he said. And they sent their disciples to him, together with the Herodians, to say, 'Master, we know that you are an honest man and teach the way of God in an honest way, and that you are not afraid of anyone, because a man's rank means nothing to you. Tell us your opinion, then. Is it permissible to pay taxes to Caesar or not?' But Jesus was aware of their malice and replied, 'You hypocrites! Why do you set this trap for me? Let me see the money you pay the tax with.' They handed him a denarius, and he said, 'Whose head is this? Whose name?' 'Caesar's' they replied. He then said to them, 'Very well, give back to Caesar what belongs to Caesar – and to God what belongs to God.'

## *REFLECTION ON THE GOSPEL*

A young lady was on a beach when a little boy came up to her and asked her, "Do you believe in God?" She was surprised by the question but she replied, "Why yes I do." Then he asked her, "Do you go to church every Sunday?" Again her answer was yes. He then asked, "Do you read the Bible and pray every day?" Again she said yes but her curiosity was very much aroused. The little boy looked up at her and sighed mightily in relief and said, "Will you hold my quarter while I go swimming?"

The little boy was straightforward and honest in his questions because he wanted to entrust to the lady something valuable to him. In the gospel reading today the Pharisees are not being honest. They have no intent in entrusting Jesus with anything. They are not looking for the answer to a question. They don't want someone to hold their quarter. They are looking for a way to get rid of this trouble making Nazarene named Jesus. And Jesus knows their dishonesty. The most interesting part of Jesus' clever avoiding of the trap was that it stands for all time as another one of those issues that will always come up in the lives of us humans who live in a world of relationships that needs government. Taxes and government are part and parcel of human life.

Also, as human beings who cannot live and develop without being in relationship with other human beings, we can really pose the questions for ourselves: to whom do we belong, to whom are we faithful, from whom do we expect support, whom do we support, who provides for us our identity, who do we allow to have authority over us, to whom are we accountable? The way we answer these questions determines in a large part who we are.

Brothers and sisters, Jesus, in the Gospel, comes to challenge us to make decisions about our life, not to provide a ready list of solutions to every question that we raise or problem that we encounter. He challenges us to speak our word and act on it.

Jesus' word is a challenge, an invitation to his questioners, to look at themselves from another angle, not as subjects who willingly or unwillingly use the Roman system, but who they really are despite their shortcomings, the image and likeness of God. If only they could see that the pure image and likeness of God is the one speaking to them, then they might be able to look at themselves from his perspective. Since our humanity comes from God, we have a responsibility to never lose sight of its sanctity.
